As we begin a new year I want to share a devotional from L.B Cowman's - Streams In The Desert

I will] move along slowly at the pace of the flocks and herds before me and the pace of the children. GENESIS 33: 14

*What a beautiful picture of Jacob's thoughtfulness for the cattle and the children! He would not allow them to be driven too hard for even one day. He would not lead them at a pace equal to what a strong man like Esau could keep or expected them to keep, but only one as fast as they were able to endure. By traveling with them, he knew exactly how far they could go in a day, and he made that his only consideration in planning their travel. He had taken the same wilderness journey years before and knew from personal experience its roughness, heat, and distance. And so he said, "I will move along slowly, since you have never been this way before" (Joshua 3: 4).*

*We "have never been this way before," but the Lord Jesus has. It is all untraveled and unknown ground to us, but He knows it all through personal experience. He knows the steep places that take our breath away, the rocky paths that make our feet ache, the hot and shadeless stretches that bring us to exhaustion, and the rushing rivers that we have to cross. Jesus has gone through it all before us. As John 4: 6 shows, "Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down." He was battered by every possible torrent, but all the floodwaters coming against Him never quenched His love. Jesus was made a perfect leader by the things He suffered. "He knows how we are formed, he remembers that we are dust" (Psalm 103: 14). Think of that when you are tempted to question the gentleness of His leading. He remembers all the time and will never make you take even one step beyond what your feet are able to endure. Never mind if you think you are unable to take another step, for either He will strengthen you to make you able, or He will call a sudden halt, and you will not have to take it at all. # NAZARENE MISSIONS INTERNATIONAL

In November the Northern Michigan District had the awesome opportunity to send a Work and Witness Team to the Invisible Conference held in Kyrenia, Cyprus. Over 500 Nazarene lay leaders and missionaries from the Church of the Nazarene's Eurasia Region attended this conference. The Eurasia Region includes 93 different nations or distinct areas across Europe, the Middle East, South Asia, North Africa, and the CIS. Our small team was formed on very short notice after two teams on other districts were forced to back out and we received an urgent request to send a team. Our mission was to care for the children of the delegates and missionaries during the one-week conference. We had only six team members for this big task. They included our District Superintendent, Daniel Gilmore and his wife, Jackie, along with my husband, Rick, and myself. We also recruited friends from the Northwest and Southwest Indiana Districts, Susan Sheets and Nancy Smith, as a part of the team.

We ministered to approximately 35 children from 17 different countries, including Russia, Kosovo, Spain, Israel, Hungary, Bulgaria, Lebanon, Jordan, Sweden, Slovakia, Belarus, Holland, Sri Lanka, Germany, Argentina, France and Turkey. The children spoke Russian, Arabic, Spanish, Swedish, Czech, Dutch, German, and Turkish along with English. They ranged in age from 2 to 11 years old.

We held an extended Vacation Bible School program (ROAR) for the children with sessions in the morning, afternoon and evening (from approximately 9:00 a.m. to 9:30 pm. with a few breaks). It was VBS on steroids! We enjoyed taking the children on a pretend "Africa safari" adventure while sharing with them the story of the Israelite's escape from Egypt and journey through the wilderness to the Promised Land. Some of the older children also recited Bible memory verses for the entire conference in one of the final sessions. Our VBS assignments were Rick Rice – music; Dan and Jackie Gilmore – recreation; Susan Sheets – snacks and Bible memory (that was a little hard with so many languages); Nancy Smith – crafts; and Jill – Bible stories and drama (with help from our very own scary Pharaoh, aka DS Dan Gilmore). Thankfully, God sent a few other adults, parents and teens to help us from time to time, including one wonderful Russian lady who spoke no English. We were also blessed because many of the children could speak more than one language. One young girl in particular could speak five different languages and helped translate our Bible lessons into Arabic for our children from Lebanon and Jordan.



We were able to develop close friendships with these children and their parents (and even grandparents) during the time we had together. Most of all, we were blessed to see the diverse nature of our Church of the Nazarene and the strong leaders from so many different countries. I loved it when the children could tell the end of the Bible stories (in Arabic, Russian and other languages) before I could finish them in English. The children were well trained in the Word of God! We are blessed with a very strong church in the vast Eurasia Region!

We would like to give special thanks to the Beaverton Church and another church in Illinois who allowed us borrow their VBS materials and to Terri Ward of the Traverse City Church who let us use her video projector! Nancy Smith also donated almost all of the crafts for the VBS. We even had two suitcases of extra supplies and crafts that we sent to child ministry centers in Belarus and one of the other countries on the region.

Following the conference, our team traveled to Greece where we visited Athens, Corinth and Delphi. It was amazing to walk where Paul and our early New Testament leaders walked and where much of the history of the New Testament took place. We came home feeling very blessed by our Christian heritage and our Nazarene brothers and sisters (and especially their children) around the world. I am especially grateful for our wonderful District Superintendent and Jackie who came along side and helped us make this trip happen on such short notice. They also did the hardest job – recreation (in a hallway) with a smile! We are blessed!!!
