

#### SPRING TRAINING FOR THE CHRISTIAN

February already! Is time actually speeding up? Ash Wednesday falls on February 17th this year and that day marks the beginning of the season of Lent. For many (including me), Lent traditionally has not been a significant part of Church experience. Certainly, I am not trying to change any traditions here, but I would say that in the last several years I have begun to appreciate this time of the year to refocus on the core principles of our redemption.

I heard a pastor describe the Lenten Season as, "Spring Training for the Christian." Baseball fans will appreciate the metaphor. For me it has been a time as a pastor that I can examine and commit anew to the core command of my call to preach; that is, "To Preach Christ, Crucified." It is interesting to me that God did not specifically command us to preach Christ, resurrected, or Christ, incarnated, or Christ, glorified, etc. We must, of course, preach about all those great themes of our redemption. But, surely, the specific command to preach the crucifixion is mainly due to the flesh-displeasing nature of crucifixion. It is the theme of our redemption that could easily be abandoned.

We are called to live the crucified life and to preach the crucified Christ. Count as precious whatever helps to center and strengthen you in that holy calling. Since I now have the whole of Spring to focus on the cross (indeed, it is my focus the whole year through, but I speak of retooling), I don't get anxious about sandwiching the crucifixion between Palm Sunday and Easter anymore.

Two common beatitudes which are focused upon through Lent are humility and repentance. May we be refreshed in the command: Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up (James 4:10). In humility we turn from (repent of) our pride. Wondrously, we are then in a place to be lifted up by His mighty, sindestroying, grace. Glory to His name!

## OLIVET NAZARENE UNIVERSITY


