With the homeless shelter just behind our church property, we made our playground, field, and parking lot readily available to our neighbors. We had 3-4 families there every day throughout the summer months with whom we were able to establish relationships and minister to. Some of the children joined us for church from week to week. Many have since moved into housing, and the kids still recognize and greet us warmly in the school halls.

Over the summer, we were invited to begin a partnership with the local chapter of MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers) in ministering to mothers around Cadillac. Since then, every other Monday evening we've had 30-50 mothers gathering in our Ministry Center, growing closer together and closer to God. We provided childcare for them at each of their meetings and served them and their children.

When it was time for our Annual Harvest Festival, our MOPS friends partnered with us to make it our most successful Festival yet! Along with Bible characters, face painting, games, candy, and lots of food, it was a wonderful time of fellowship and fun with our neighbors in the community.

Perhaps one the greatest example of being a Christ-like presence in our community came through our long-time member Bill (not his real name). Bill is well-known in the community and has a job where he is often seen at the local grocery store. It was not unusual to find Bill speaking with, encouraging, and even praying with folks from the community in the aisles of Meijer.

This last year, Bill felt God calling him to reach out more to our community. Since then, he has started a Sunday School class, restarted Wednesday night prayer meetings, and begun a monthly 'Open Gym' night for the community.

It isn't always easy to gauge results from events like these, but we believe that serving our community in the name of Christ is how we are called to live. Jesus calls us to love and serve no matter where we are, no matter who we are with. That is the goal we are striving for as a church.

Escanaba Lighthouse Church of the Nazarene 2023-24

This year we are planning to focus on blessing our local community. Our town has three large churches which do major food distributions. One of those is the Salvation Army. Our congregation keeps a box in the back of the church to collect groceries which Kay delivers to the Salvation Army when she volunteers in their office.

Escanaba has an excellent Pregnancy Care center. We have a cradle in the back of our church which is used to collect baby items per their donation list which are then taken to the pregnancy care center.

Harbor Towers, a low-income apartment building has 173 units. One of our members, Diane, lives in the tower. We have re-started our quarter project. It costs \$2.50 to do a load of laundry, which is a hardship for many residents. Diana puts \$2.50 of quarters into a baggie with a card from our church that says "just because your loved". She hands them out personally trying to make sure all residents receive a touch of love. We also send devotional materials to the residents which they grab up quickly.

This year we are going to set up the "Dawn Jones Memorial Free Table". Dawn Jones, a member of our church, passed away a couple years ago. She collected gently used clothing or household goods and set them on a table in front of her home. People knew it was there, and if they needed an item, it was theirs free. Dawn kept the table full every day, covering it when it rained. When she noticed people visiting, she would go out and pray with them. We may not be able to keep up that frequency, but our plan is to bless one of our lower income neighborhoods by making it available on a regular basis.

Our sewing ladies have been making mastectomy pillows and sending them out of the area. Recently they have found an outlet in our community and have provided these locally. They are hoping to give away more in our community this coming year. They also provide lap quilts and fidget blankets to the local nursing homes and prayer shawls when they hear of a person struggling emotionally.

This year we are going to reinstitute Blessing Baskets. Each month we choose a person in our area that we hear is going through hard times emotionally or physically. We then bless that person and their family with a basketful of love. This might include gift cards, items we know they need, edible treats and some type of devotional gift.

We continue to minister to our local nursing home by preaching and providing gifts on a regular basis. We also provide Christian music for all events at the community chapel on the UP State fairgrounds.

We will continue throughout the year to keep our hearts open to however God can use us to bless our community.

Our goal for the 2024-2025 year of ministry is to complete the restructuring of a designated ministry space in the facility to offer and lead biblical parenting classes. This area/space in the facility has been long waiting to be repurposed & renovated as a large meeting area for these classes. This space will house between 30–40 parents in a "house type" setting for ministry.

We are ever aware of the many challenges that parents face as they attempt to navigate parenting in the 21st century and have a great desire to inspire parents to investigate how the Scriptures instruct, support and impact their lives as they parent their children.
